The SALGA Women's Commission (SWC) has in the past enjoyed working with Inkosikazi Mhlauli in her capacity as the Eastern Cape Provincial Chairperson of Imbumba Yamakhosikazi Akomkhulu (IYA). Her efforts resulted in more women traditional leaders accepting and leading in the House of Traditional leadership in the Eastern Cape. Working with the SWC, the IYA is part of the gender machinery work to accelerate the mainstreaming of women into government and private sectors, including traditional institutions.
