

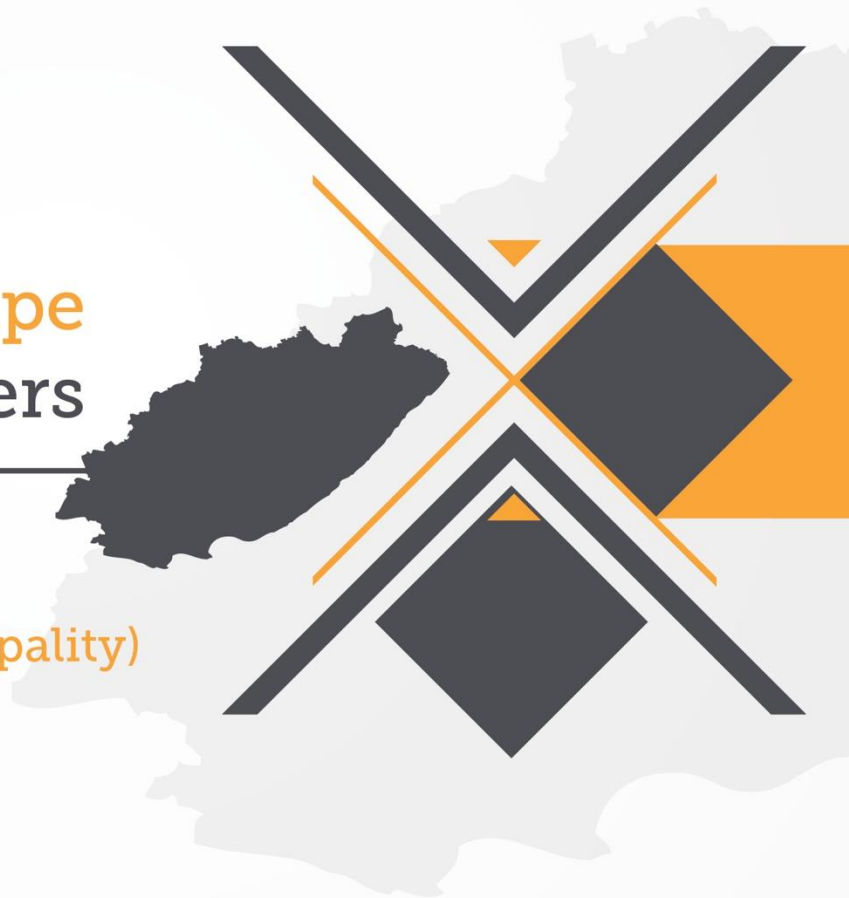

A SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM THE PROVINCIAL CHAIRPERSON

The Provincial Members Assembly is the largest gathering and a premier event of the South African Local Government Association. The Provincial Executive Committee determines who should be invited from each of our 39 members. As a platform for strategy and policy dialogue to the extent feasible, the programme will create sufficient space for all members and important stakeholders to play a substantial role either in delivering the content or constituting part of the technical resource personnel in order to enhance the required cross-pollination of ideas and harnessing the sector's collective wisdom to turn – around the state of local government in the province.

Deliberations will cover essential strategic areas to allow the local government fraternity to have a focussed attention on these areas. The programme of the PMA is structured in such a way that, there is a fair distribution of time between content delivery and deliberations by members and stakeholders on how best the Province should work cooperatively to turn – around local government in terms of governance, institutional agility and resilience, what internal controls must be introduced to enhance legislative compliance and what interventions are required to ensure that local government is not only responsive in terms of priorities but the approach to delivery such priorities is done responsibly in terms of climate-proofed and economically savvy service delivery model.

This PMA as our premier event will be attended by all our Mayors/Executive Mayors, Speakers, Chief Whips, Municipal Managers, and Chief Finance Officers from across the length and breadth of our province. A number of stakeholders such as Heads of Departments, CEOs of Municipal Development Entities, civil society, organised business, labour and representatives of our esteemed Traditional Leaders will grace this important gathering of SALGA.

The theme of the PMA is **'Working cooperatively to recalibrate local government professionalisation towards effective service delivery, institutional agility and resilience, financial viability, sound, responsive and inclusive governance'**. The key elements of the theme as written therein seek to focus our attention to the current state of local government in the province. While it comes across as more emphatic on the state of local government, it is deliberately intended to compel all of us to own up to the current state of local government and therefore cooperatively commit to a minimum programme to work towards an agreed-upon model municipality.

The PMA will kick-off with the launch of our flagship campaign to bridge the social distance between members and consumers of municipal services. The strategic thrust of this campaign is to reignite a sense of ownership of municipalities by citizenry, meaningful involvement of communities in municipal governance, planning and provision of service delivery and therefore payment for rates and services.

The opening session will be addressed by the Honourable Premier, the President of SALGA, the MECs for Provincial Treasury and Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, and this will be followed by a high-powered grand debate whose strategic focus will be the extent to which the sector has sufficiently





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grasped the inherent complexities of the demands for leadership dynamism, political maturity, institutional agility and resilience and responsive political and legislative precepts in the context of coalition politics. This important grand debate will be anchored by our new Member of the Provincial Executive Council for Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs Honourable Zolile Williams. In addition to this main input, there will be inputs from various panellist including a second component of this grand debate whose supplementary thrust is foregrounded on municipal institutional resilience, viability and critical building blocks towards a model municipality.

The PMA will immediately after the grand debate break into the four strategic sessions where the nuts and bolts of crucial elements of what is to be done will be discussed. Content experts will lead various topics and as a key requirement, each of these breakaway sessions must agree on a minimum programme of action to turn – around local government in the Eastern Cape

In line with the internal governance precepts, the PMA will conclude by addressing corporate governance matters such as organisational performance, future plans and financial matters in a closed session.

This year's edition, that will be held on **28th – 30th of November 2022 at the Wild Coast Sun in Winnie Nomzamo Madikizela Mandela within Alfred Nzo District Municipality.**

BACKGROUND

SALGA Constitution enjoins the Provincial Executive Committee to convene a Provincial Members Assembly (PMA) in order to review and report on the past year performance of the organization as well as adopt the action plan for the ensuing year. The Assembly also serves as a strategic platform for members to discuss internal as well as external factors/challenges confronting the sector and to strengthen cooperative governance and facilitate solutions for the local government sector. The PMA therefore is an annual gathering and premier event for SALGA members in Eastern Cape and offers a fantastic opportunity to network, learn, share knowledge and influence the future agenda of organized local government in the province.

The PMA will focus on key issues affecting local government such as the increasing number of municipalities that are experiencing extreme financial difficulties, the spiralling debts, deepening governance crises especially in municipalities that are governed through coalitions as well as the major service delivery challenges inclusive of poor performance in terms of grant expenditure, capacity constraints, an increasing threat to democracy which is manifestly reflected in vandalism, killing of councillors and municipal officials. The members' assembly provides an opportunity and serves as the correct platform for delegates to achieve the following:

- i. To learn best practices and gain new insight to address their municipal challenges
- ii. To network with Mayors, Speakers, the Premier, MECs and other delegates
- iii. Learn from expert panellists and industry experts
- iv. Exchange and share knowledge
- v. Interact and network with exhibitors and other key relevant stakeholders
- vi. Act in accordance with the directions of the Provincial Conference;
- vii. Adopt the provincial programme of action, business plan and budget in respect of the ensuing year;
- viii. Consider reports from the Provincial Executive Committee; and
- ix. Deal with any other pertinent issues that may be considered urgent for the sector.

As succinctly reflected in the paragraph above, the Provincial Members Assembly of the Eastern Cape takes place at the time the local government sector is experiencing a number of challenges including but





not limited to declining levels of oversight, institutional capacity constraints, inadequate funding coupled with compromised internal controls systems and revenue collection levels. These challenges are often exacerbated by destructive wild cat community protests, political and judicial overreach and burdensome over-regulations. In order to allow sufficient space for deliberations on these matters, the 2022/2023 PMA has provided a considerable amount of time to deliberate on these matters.

To a greater extent the programme is structured in such a manner that it enables participants to dissect issues and package concrete solutions. The programme is also deliberately structured to compel all elements to embed gender mainstreaming and come up with practical actionable proposals in accordance with their specific areas of discussion. The second day of the programme has structured to conclude presentation of the minimum local government turn – around programme for the province. In order to ensure proper alignment, the third part of the PMA is structured in accordance with the clusters as provided in the 2022 – 2027 SALGA Local Government Strategic Agenda, albeit succinctly, overview of key highlights and areas of continuous engagement are provided in relevant parts of the programme.

The South African municipalities need managers who are competent, diligent and loyal in their work. <p>16:30 – 18:30</p>	<p>The current under-funding of local government, and its consequent financial distress, is a direct result of the fiscal assumptions made in the 1998 Local Government White Paper. The 1998 White Paper envisaged a situation of long-term equilibrium facilitated by the notion of the equitable share, in terms of this, local government would be allocated certain functions and responsibilities, and it would fund those partly through own revenue. The shortfall that remained would be funded through transfers to local government of a portion of nationally raised revenue under the equitable share system. In this way, the equitable share would be the critical tool that ensured equilibrium in the system, by ensuring that local government would always have access to sufficient financial resources to deliver its mandate in full. Dis-equilibrium between the two sides of this equation occurs when the financial resources required to deliver the functions and responsibilities are not sufficient, and the equitable share cannot make up the difference. This is further compounded by the inherently dismissive approach when new legislation and its likely burdensome effect on the financial affairs of local government is deliberately disregarded or wittingly ignored. This is by no means suggestive of a local government system that has been relatively prudent, effective and efficient; but points to a dialectical relationship between the foregoing and inherent systemic challenges that each municipality in the Eastern Cape and across the Republic continue to experience.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i.
